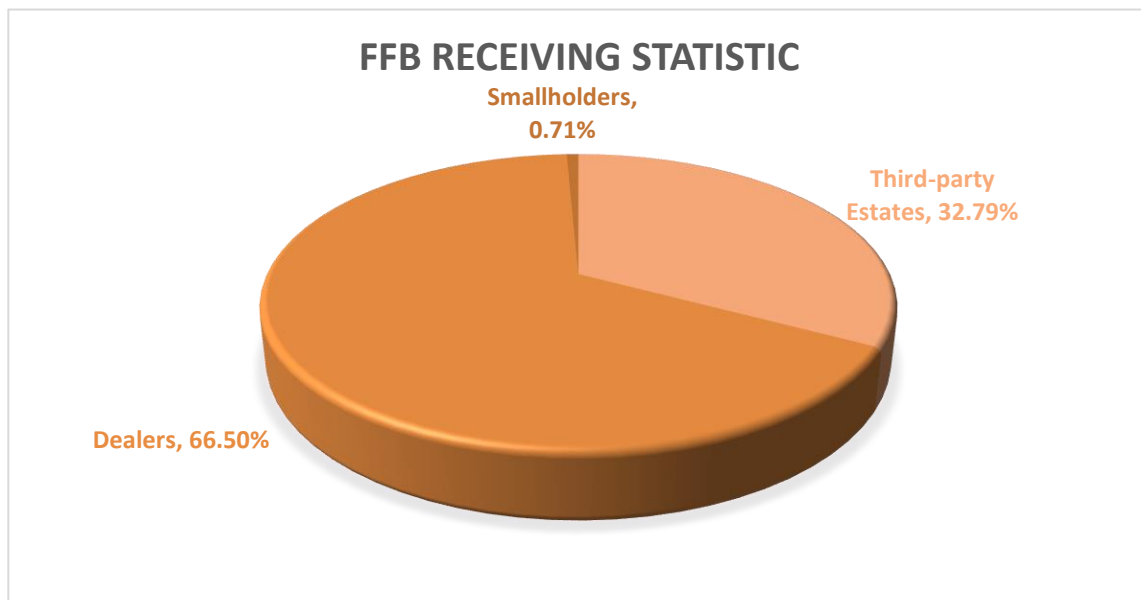



B. Environmental Risk Analysis

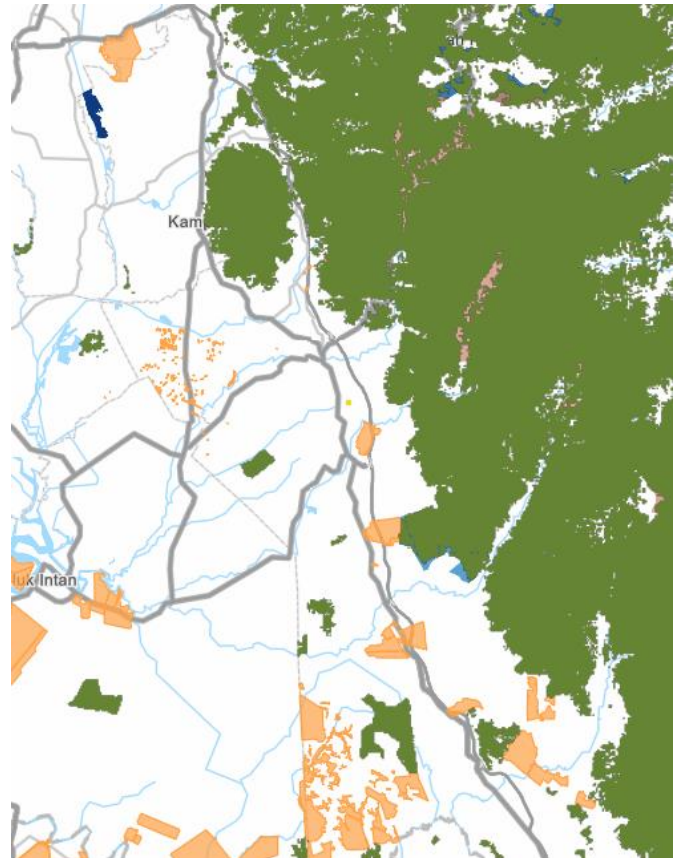
