In March 2020, Sabah had the third-highest number of confirmed cases nationwide while Tawau was declared as one of the COVID-19 "red zone" cities in Malaysia. Our subsidiary company, Mewah Datu Sdn Bhd, donated 2 units of Life-Support Ventilators that worth more than RM100,000 to Tawau General Hospital in response to the acute shortage of medical supplies faced by the hospital. The ventilator is a life saving breathing machine for the critically ill patients of COVID-19.
